FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My sisters and brothers, for a change from the Sundays of the Ordinary Time of the liturgical year, this weekend we celebrate the solemnity of the apostles Peter and Paul.

Consider this match-up. The one side, the Roman army of occupation, assigns four squads of soldiers to take charge of guarding the prisoner. The centurion in charge assigns two of these soldiers to chain themselves to the prisoner with double chains every night. A set of guards is stationed at the door of the prisoner's cell; another set of guards is stationed down the hall. The whole operation is staged inside a walled compound, sealed with a locked iron gate.

The other side, the prisoner's friends, pray. There's the match-up. Which side will win?

The above is the scenario presented to us in the first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, and it goes on to describe how the conflict is resolved. The Christian community's prayers are answered, the power of God intervenes, and Peter walks through the Roman military force as though he were pushing his thumb through papier-mâché.

It would be wrong for us to put a fundamentalist interpretation to this incident, that God will always release faithful people directly from their oppressors; nor is it correct to suggest that God always intervenes concretely to give us exactly what we want when we pray with sincerity. Rather, the above incident evidences in a concrete and dramatic fashion the basic Christian scriptural teaching about prayer. There is no force on earth available to us that is more powerful than prayer. Prayer works in mysterious ways that are beyond human manipulation.

Human forces are predictable. We can measure them with various instruments and be fairly accurate in our predictions about their outcomes. But, when prayer is involved, "what 'appears to be' is not the sum total of what 'is'." There is always more beneath the surface. There is always a divine mystery to be unfolded.

By all human odds Peter should never have escaped. However, the Roman force didn't take one factor into account. Peter's friends were praying for him.

Can we factor in the power of prayer when confronted with apparently insurmountable obstacles in our journey of life?
